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Waiting Room Greeter Volunteer

Description: The Waiting Room Greeter will work directly with customers of the Mental Health Center. They will be responsible to interact with customers by greeting them with a smile, answering questions related to facility or bus routes, directing customers to appointments, and dispensing coffee or water to customers in the waiting room. Volunteers should sign-in on the Volunteer Time Sheet at the start and end of their shift.

Preparation: A general overview of Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center and its programs will be conducted by the Volunteer Coordinator at the start of the scheduled volunteer time. Volunteers will be provided a tour of the facility to include vending and restroom availability. The Volunteer Coordinator will provide any program-specific information required as part of the orientation process. Tasks include:

- Greet customers and vendors as they enter the lobby through the main door
- Assist with directing customers to appointments to group sessions
- Provide information to customers regarding bus routes
- Ask customers and vendors if they would like coffee or water and provide

Qualifications: Volunteers should want to help their community through volunteering; have the ability to follow simple directions; be able to read and write at a high school level or above; and work well in a group setting. Volunteers should be outgoing and friendly, yet demonstrate appropriate boundaries and judgment through their interactions with clients and staff.

Benefits: Volunteers will develop an understanding of mental illness and chemical dependency. By providing a friendly face to someone in need, volunteers will get satisfaction from helping to make the customer's experience at ZVMHC pleasant.

Supervision: Volunteers will work directly with the Volunteer Coordinator and Front Desk staff, and are encouraged to ask questions they have about the volunteer opportunity.

Dress or Equipment Needed: Casual dress is acceptable as long as it is neat and clean. Volunteers will be asked to adhere to the agency dress code; a copy of which will be provided. If your shift is around lunch or dinner, please eat prior to your volunteer time. Vending is available.
