Through our range of rehab and support programs, Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center provides instruction on basic activities for daily living, referrals to medical and educational services and help finding community resources for people with mental health and substance use disorders.

Our highly skilled and experienced staff use evidence-based practices to focus on helping you secure the resources necessary to live on your own. And, many of our staff members speak multiple languages, including Somali, Vietnamese and Cambodian.

Other Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center Programs

Chemical Health Services

- *Connections and Referral Unit* – secure, 24-hour detoxification program that provides short-term (up to 72 hours) help to adults and adolescents under the influence of alcohol or other substances
- *Recovery programs* – series of outpatient treatment programs designed to help adults overcome their dependence on alcohol and/or other chemicals

Children’s Programs

- *Children’s Mental Health Resource Center* – provides a series of support services to families of children with severe emotional disturbances
- *Root River Day Treatment* – program that offers mental health treatment to middle and high school students in a school-based setting

Housing

- *Housing options* – program that offers housing subsidies and assistance to locate safe, affordable housing to adults with a mental illness
- *Homeless services* – permanent housing program that provides case management and supportive services to single adults who are long-term homeless or chronic long-term homeless

Intensive Residential Treatment

- *Residential and crisis stabilization* – on-site program that provides mental health services for up to 12 adults
- *Crisis stabilization* – on-site program available for up to four adults requiring immediate support with their behavioral health symptoms

Outpatient Therapy Services

- *Psychiatric and psychological services* – therapy available to adults and children in individual and group settings to help participants heal emotionally and regain normal functioning

Case Management

Dedicated case managers will provide support and the basic resources to help you live independently. Your case manager will work with you to:

- Find existing community resources
- Create a support plan based upon your specific needs
- Get referrals to medical, social and educational services
- Provide advocacy services when needed

All services are tailored to your unique needs. This includes a complete assessment, coordination of care, crisis assistance, monitoring and follow up. And, many of our case managers are bilingual, allowing us to provide culturally sensitive services.



Operating under Rule 79 of the Minnesota Statute, our case managers work with hundreds of individuals – including Somali, Vietnamese and Cambodian – each year.

Eligibility Criteria *

- Diagnosis of serious and persistent mental illness
- Referral from Olmsted County Social Services, Adult Behavioral Health Unit
- Olmsted County resident or financial responsibility of the county
- Age 18 or older

** Eligibility is determined by the Olmsted County Department of Social Services – Adult Behavioral Health Unit.*

Fillmore County Programs

Zumbro Valley Mental Health Center works with Fillmore County to offer a variety of community support services to county residents.

Programs include:

- **Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services** – focus on teaching independent living skills
- **Case management** – assists people with serious and persistent mental illnesses to function independently through education about available community resources; referrals to medical, social and educational services; and advocacy assistance
- **Intensive Community Rehabilitation Services** – offers individuals diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness a range of clinical and rehabilitation services to prevent hospitalizations, civil commitments, incarcerations and other adverse outcomes
- **Outpatient therapy services** – psychiatry and counseling services for all stages of life, including specialized therapy for adults

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Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services

This program is designed to help you learn the day-to-day skills to live independently. Staff will teach you basic activities of daily living, techniques to better structure your day, managing medications, how to improve socialization and interpersonal skills with others and tips on setting daily goals.

Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services (ARMHS) focuses on teaching rehab skills to eligible adults in a group or independent setting. This includes independent living skills like budgeting, nutrition education, illness management and recovery, interpersonal skills and education about medications. Services are offered in English, Somali, Vietnamese and Cambodian.

Intensive Community Rehabilitation Services

The Intensive Community Rehabilitation Services (ICRS) program provides a range of integrated services – psychiatry, case management, Adult Rehabilitation Mental Health Services, medication education and others – to help you build your own support network and develop the self-confidence to achieve your personal goals. Your team of skilled professionals will work with you to create a treatment plan based upon your needs. Together we can build the foundation for an independent lifestyle.

Eligibility criteria

- You must be 18 years of age or older
- You must have a diagnosis of a serious and persistent mental illness
- You must be a resident of Olmsted or Fillmore county
- The services must be deemed medically necessary
- You must be willing to work with a multi-disciplinary (psychiatrist, case manager, and nurse) team

Referrals are accepted from hospitals, clinics, community providers and the social service departments of Olmsted and Fillmore counties. Self-referrals and referrals from family members also can be received.
